

## SUMMARY

This exhibition offers a retrospection and an unveiling at the same time. The participating artists have shown repeatedly in our gallery the last years – between Brescia and Munich. Hence we invite our audience for a deeper encounter with their older and newer works.

With our selection from the series „Paris Noir“ by **Stefania Beretta** (\*1957) – prominently presented within the scope of „Eyes on Paris“ 2011/2012, Deichtorhallen Hamburg as well as at the Picasso Museum Münster 2015 (both exhibitions curated by Hans Michael Koetzle) – we focus on an important working complex containing all the characteristics of her artistic research: the oscillation between the concrete image and its mysterious obscurring, a preference for black ambiences, and the travelling in-between places and worlds.

**Norbert Eberle's** (\*1954) delicate drawings are intended to establish metaphorical rooms to shelter the insinuation of the real and personal experience. His linear constructions develop instinctively and systematically in the same time, and are piloted by a secure feeling for the traces of being and life, for the complicated enmeshments of rational awareness and dreamlike devotion to emotional processes.

With this selection of works, **Annette Lucks** (\*1952) demonstrates again her particular talent for excursions to connect and intertwine word, drawing, pictorial figuration and metaphorical abstraction in scenic arrangements. Seemingly verisimilar stories are told, which capture the spectator within the realm of her fantasy and into the land where her themes and subjects originate.

The series „Yodada“ by **Helga Schmidhuber** will be accompanied by a sort of „book collages“. Born in 1972 in Wiesbaden and graduating from the famous Academy of Fine Arts in Düsseldorf, under professors Dieter Krieg and Albert Oehlen, her work reflects more than one aspect of several tendencies found in contemporary art. This is evident not only with an indentation of different levels and disciplines, which are overlapping and gearing into each other, but also thematically, by the ironical decomposition of classical artistic aforisms and their reinterpretation and revision, from the portrait of nature up to the surrealistic alienation of object.

**Holger Schmidhuber** (\*1970) has been dedicated to the examination of pertinent distributed labels and common slogans. He is passionately interested in the sophisticated amalgamation of word, message, image and association. For instance illustrated by his series „marylin“, shown in our spaces in 2015, as well as in his most recent work „carpets“. The title „Resist“ could also be a motto for our exhibition as a whole, as we have not surrendered to our courageous and tireless engagement for the artistic position and expression. Holger Schmidhuber does not know fear of contamination in contact with the common commodity. These frontiers have been long ago thrown down, and the concept of art widened, with surprising results.

**Annegret Soltau** (\*1946) is considered the „Doyenne“ of feminist oriented artistic operation. Photography is her medium – or better: photography serves as a tool to analyse identity and projection. Her development started with graphics and spatial embroilments, in the seventies, to arrive later on at the point to sew on photography and finally, till today, to sew photographic fragments. The „Leitmotiv“: a continuous and insisting investigation mostly with the female (own) physical presence and the social conditioning of our existence.

Our exhibition offers therefore – with 3 generations – a survey on certain developments in contemporary art today, as well as, a summary of the positions and perspectives in which our gallery is principally interested and engaged with.
