

ANDREA SULZER

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15 September – 4 November 2018

Opening: Friday, 14 September, 7 p.m. The artist will be present.



Drawing and graphics are the focus of the works by Andrea Sulzer (b. 1961 in New York). As with the gallery's other artists, her engagement with a kind of collaging process, a kind of simulation or continuation of the classical concept of collage plays a central role, taking shape as an aesthetic discussion of historical premises and patterns of perception that manifest themselves in the work. Fragmented sketches, suspended and yet thoughtfully composed, which might indeed originate from a tangible object, be placed directly onto paper or stitched paper, then mounted onto wood, cut into pieces, reassembled, dented, crumpled and sculpturally extended, form a nexus of works.



Before turning to a creative career at the Glasgow School of Art, Sulzer initially studied forest biology. Nature and landscape have remained just as significant as sources of inspiration, as have aspects like mutability, processual events, fractures and upheavals, and uncertainties as fundamental and steadfast conditions of existence. These are reflected in the works, which ultimately possess a lyrical quality, constitute a poetic, dreamful tone. Abrupt gestures, brisk exchange and rhythms, seemingly figurative and abstract signs merge 'like the fluid and unstable nature of memory' (Andrea Sulzer), uniting in complex pictorial structures. 'Images dissolve and reorganise themselves, leaving the impression of a story that resists being told.' Observations overlap with historical and experiential impressions; a dialogue then arises, in part dramatic or lively, from these leaps in time, from the confrontation of reality and abstraction. Tension and balance held in suspense in a sophisticated equilibrium dominate and characterise these works. Sulzer explores the boundaries between the space of two-dimensional drawing and the space with which it relates the surrounding space, interior space, or space in between. Her folios sometimes comprise a multilayered structure, particularly since up to eighty layers of ink can be laid over one another. Sulzer successfully lends her medium an ambiguous, a hybrid dimension, which goes far beyond the familiar matter of drawing and, by contrast, defines her art anew, placing it on a timely basis that approaches a discipline of mixed forms. Illustration thus experiences a zestful regeneration.

"My mark-making – a weaving of the past into the present – is not so much a way to record time but a way to be in time."(Sulzer, 2008)
